Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at St. Mary's in the side chapel Monday, Wednesday and Friday, from after Mass until 2pm, and at St. Paul's on a Tuesday from after Mass until 2pm *This is a sacred space for those who would like to pray in silence before the Blessed Sacrament*

We begin Ordinary Time with an introduction to Jesus prior to his ministry. Today only John the Baptist speaks. He introduces Jesus to his own disciples as 'the Lamb of God'. Jewish families would choose a lamb from their flocks to offer to God at Passover. Jesus is God's choice of victim: the one who takes away the sins of the world. God, the mystery of divine love, is made visible for us in Christ Jesus. Are we ready to follow Jesus through the days and months of 2020, allowing the Saviour to influence our responses to the events of daily life?

During Ordinary Time we are invited to open ourselves to the unfolding of the mystery of Christ in all its aspects. This unfolding is a rich tapestry and demands our attention to detail. In the end it will take us to the Passion and Death of Jesus on Good Friday and the Celebration of his Resurrection on Sunday April 12th, 2020.

At the moment, green is the colour of the season and the Gloria is sung or said on all Sundays, Solemnities and Feasts. The Creed is recited on Sundays and Solemnities.
